ABSTRACT: "... Public integrity is key to a resilient response to the COVID-19 crisis, ensuring that government action benefits those in need. This crisis creates opportunities for many integrity violations and could intensify fraud and corruption, particularly in public procurement, economic stimulus packages and public organisations. This could significantly undermine government action...."

".... In addition, as governments transition from addressing the immediate crisis to focusing on economic recovery, integrity violations may continue to rise and undermine recovery efforts. It is therefore imperative that fundamental safeguards of public integrity are not weakened or disregarded in both the immediate response as well as the longer-term recovery from COVID-19....."

Assuming that Canada is a member "in good standing" in OECD, should it not follow the guidelines and advices of that organization with respect to the apparent conflict of interest" as evidenced in Exhibit 20 involving the WHO? (In essence involved in some sense, "managing suppliers"?).
